## **GOALS**

The North Carolina Coalition Against Sexual Assault (NCCASA) is the sole statewide organization working to end sexual violence and human trafficking through education, advocacy, and legislation. For the 2019-2020 North Carolina General Assembly session, NCCASA was able to accomplish our entire legislative agenda.

#### Increase in RCC Funding

NCCASA advocated for CARES Act funding. This funding passed and allocated an additional 6 million in funding for North Carolina Rape Crisis Centers to assist with pandemic-related costs.

#### Sexual Assault Evidence Collection Kit Funding & Policy Guidance

NCCASA supported the Attorney General's request for \$6 million in funding to clear the rape kit backlog and set clear policy guidance for evidence collection. This passed and NCCASA was a part of the working group to prioritize rape kits for testing.

#### Incapcitation Language

NCCASA advocated for closing the incapacitation loophole. The law had a loophole that if a victim was voluntarily incapacitated and then sexually assaulted, the perpetrator would not be charged with 2nd degree rape. NCCASA was successful in changing this statute.

#### Withdrawal of Consent

NCCASA advocated for a statutory change to allow withdrawal of consent once a sexual act has begun. This passed the General Assembly and became law, overturning the 1979 State v. Way case.



#### Extension of Statute of Limitations for Child Sexual Abuse

NCCASA advocated for an extension of the statute of limitations for child sexual abuse. In a compromise with the Senate leadership, we successfully got the statute of limitations extended to age 28.

## Play Defense on Detrimental Bills

NCCASA successfully stopped detrimental sexual assault bills that were introduced.

## **OUTCOMES**

#### Through pre and post surveys, training evaluations, and feedback, we are better able to serve our community.

Hearing from our members and fellow advocates help shape the services we provide. Developing and brainstorming future resources has always remained a large priority for NCCASA.



#### Over the course of the year, our training institute:

- Delivered 71 trainings
- **3216** training institute registrants
- Received 3462 views of recorded webinars on YouTube

### TRAINING INSTITUTE

NCCASA provided 702 instances of technical assistance to members. Below is a breakdown of the type of technical assistance provided:

50% Program and Organization Issues Sustainability, personnel, grant management, etc.

#### 25% Program Services Case management, med

Case management, medical advocacy, legal advocacy, support group, counseling,

25% Other (publications, membership, training registration, etc.)

#### When surveyed, members said:

- 81% received good to excellent quality of technical assistance
- 93% received good to excellent membership benefits
- 70% felt NCCASA made efforts to actively engage their agency in statewide efforts

## OUR Advocacy

#### NCCASA provides technical support to rape crisis centers and other members across the state.

We do our work by using a social justice framework to ensure we are serving marginalized communities. We strive to make our services accessible to all people, and by taking an intersectional approach, all communities are served.



Over the course of the year, the Anti-Human Trafficking program:

- Delivered 7 trainings from the manual, Expanding Our Reach: Equipping NC's Rape Crisis Centers to Serve Survivors of Human Trafficking
- Delivered 8 trainings on HT advocacy and direct service

The Supporting Survivors Reentrants Project (SSRP) is a **pilot program** in Orange County designed to build partnership between the local rape crisis centers and the local reentry council to **better equip survivors** of human trafficking and sexual violence with available **resources** as they reenter the community.

## OUR IMPACT

#### NCCASA works with advocates every day toward a world free from sexual violence.

We truly believe that this is an attainable goal. By engaging with youth, teens, adults, and all members of our community, we are growing closer each day to the end of sexual violence.

Through the use of both pre and post tests, participants increased their understanding of sexual assault, human trafficking and skillset development by **80**%.



The Young Advocates Institute (YAI) has grown significantly:

- Replication in Mississippi and Arizona (YAI-South/YAI-Southwest)
- YAI has trained 1,650 students through 125 course offerings of social justice issues and leadership development themed content
- A documentary celebrating the Institute's decade of work to be released Fall 2021
